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INGHAMS ENTERPRISES PTY LTD (Ingleburn) ENTERPRISE AGREEMENT - 1997

PREAMBLE

This agreement made the <u>3RD</u> th day of <u>DCTOBER</u> 1997 between Inghams Enterprises Pty Ltd (hereinafter referred to as the 'Company') and The Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union - New South Wales Branch (hereinafter referred to as the 'Union'), records that it is mutually agreed as follows:

1. TITLE

This agreement shall be known as the Inghams Enterprises Pty Ltd (Ingleburn) Enterprise Agreement 1997.

2. ARRANGEMENT

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3. APPLICATION

This agreement shall apply at the Inghams Enterprises Pty Ltd Ingleburn further processing plant located at Benson Road Ingleburn, New South Wales, only in respect to its employee covered by the Poultry Industry Preparation (State) Award Award (IRC no 6081 of 1996) and the Poultry Industry Preparation Wages (State) Award. Award. (IRC no 6081 of 1996).

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4. PARTIES BOUND

This agreement shall be binding upon:

- (a) Inghams Enterprises Pty Ltd;
- (b) The Australasian Meat Industry Employees' Union New South Wales Branch; and
- (c) All employees of the Company covered by the Award working at the Ingleburn Plant.

5. RELATIONSHIP TO EXISTING AWARD

This agreement shall be read and interpreted in conjunction with the Poultry Industry Preparation (State) Award, (IRC no 6081of1996) and the Poultry Industry Preparation Wages (State) Award. (IRC no 6081of1996), but in the event of any inconsistency between this agreement and the above awards, this agreement shall take precedence. This agreement replaces the A A Tegel (Ingleburn) and AMIEU Enterprise Agreement 1993.

6. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

Since 1991 enterprise agreements have been entered into between Inghams Enterprises Pty Ltd and the AMIEU at the various Company plants in New South Wales with the general objectives of:

- Improving the productivity, efficiency and flexibility of the enterprise through the
 effective implementation of agreed measures which would significantly increase the
 competitiveness of the Company and offer secure and worthwhile employment for its
 employees.
- Developing an environment of continuous improvement which is conducive to a flexible work organisation able to respond to changing demands in the industry.
- Adopting a participative approach to implementing increased and sustained productivity improvements across all areas of the operations of the Company.

Unfortunately the changes implemented to date have not kept pace with the competitive and cost pressures facing the Company.

Through this agreement the parties seek to record the measures by which the pressures and demands on the Company can be met.

7. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this agreement is to establish the framework within which the changes necessary to meet the challenges facing the Company and its employees will be implemented.

While the timing of the introduction of the changes will be decided by the Company in the context of its operational requirements, employees will be consulted regarding reche introduction of the changes and measures to avert or mitigate any adverse effects of such entertainment changes on employees.

8. WORKPLACE CHANGE

Following negotiations between the parties the following measures designed to achieve real gains in productivity, efficiency and flexibility have or will be implemented.

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8.1 Hours

- (a) The ordinary hours of work for current permanent day workers shall be worked between 5:00 am and 5:00 pm unless otherwise agreed. However, for new employees and casuals the ordinary hours of work for day workers may be worked between 5:00 am and 6:00 pm. The afternoon shift shall be a shift finishing after 6 pm and at or before 1:00 am.
- (b) By agreement hours worked before 5.00 am by a day worker may be counted as part of an employee's ordinary hours for that day, provided that the time worked prior to 5 am is paid at overtime rates. This clause does not preclude the Company from working employees overtime prior to 5 am.

8.2 Absenteeism

The following measures will be introduced to reduce the current unacceptable levels of absenteeism:

- (a) If any employee is absent from work (unpaid) in any week, then that employee shall not be offered overtime in that week or the following week at the Company's discretion.
- (b) Any employee who arrives at work 15 minutes past their scheduled start time and has not advised the company that they will be late may be sent home without pay. The employee may apply for payment as for or a rostered day off or as a day of annual leave. Sick leave shall not be available in such circumstances.
- (c) An employee absent from work because of illness or injury shall prior to normal starting time, notify his/her supervisor to their inability to attend for work and as far as may be practicable, state the general nature of the illness or injury and the estimated duration of the absence.

8.3 Other Productivity Measures

(a) Waste Reduction - Waste reduction in processing by Industrial Registration involvement in measuring of performance.

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(b) Reduction Of Disposed Meat - Reduction of meat disposed as a result of being dropped on the floor by increased awareness and effort in stopping meat hitting the floor.

- (c) Performance Evaluations Introduction of performance evaluations for shop floor employees.
- (d) Training Assistance in developing and implementing training programs and training for the shop floor.
- (e) Casual Ratio The current flexibility with respect to casual ratios, as well as the Company's objective to comply with the spirit of the Award in this regard, is acknowledged. However, it is recognised and agreed that promotions and seasonal trading (e.g. Christmas stock build-up from weeks 42-52) have and always will be an exception.
- (f) Staffing Réduction by one (1) employee in the portion cutting/ packaging (Multivac) operation.
- (g) Increased Productivity Batches produced on the FPP (Further Poultry Processing) Multivac take 15 minutes less on average due to an increase in processing speed as a result of materials handling modifications.
- (h) Shop Floor Initiative in oven utilisation Combining of differing product racks to reduce the overall number of cooks required per working day.
- (i) Minor Adjustments Minor machine adjustments to be made by trained personnel, where there adjustments are deemed to be safe. A program will be developed whereby certain meat workers are trained by a tradesperson to carry out minor adjustments and machine changes. This program will be developed in conjunction with appropriate metal trades employees after agreement with the Union.
- (j) Process Quality Quality must be built into our products if we are to compete in the markets in which we are engaged. To this end quality must become the responsibility of everyone. The parties are committed to introducing a system involving on-line checks and paperwork to ensure quality is built into products while in process. How this is achieved will be subject to discussion by the Consultative Committee.
- (k) Picnic Day The plant will no longer close for the "Award Picnic Day" which will become a normal working day. Employees shall be entitled to a picnic day holiday on a rostered basis to be taken at a time mutual agreed between the Company and the employee. Provided that such day be a Prime day (i.e. Monday or Friday) unless otherwise agreed.

- (l) Staggered Breaks - The existence of staggered breaks in the operation is acknowledged. The parties recognised the improvement through staggered breaks and this may be extended following consultation between the parties.
- The four programmed seven minute rest breaks shall no longer apply Agreement (m)
- The meals and rest periods provided in Clause 9 of the award shall be taken at such times as mutually agreed between the such times as mutually agreed between times and times agreed between times agreed bet (n) such times as mutually agreed between supervisors and employees by section.
- During the Christmas stock build period the employer may decide to substitute (o) up to 3 "rostered days off" for other days to be taken in conjunction with the plant Christmas closure or annual leave. The days actually worked shall be treated as ordinary working days.
- With 14 days notice the company may implement a plant rostered day off. (p) Provided that only one such RDO may be notified each month.

8.4 **Quarterly Meeting**

At a time mutually agreed between the Company and the Union one mass meeting of employees of a maximum duration of 60 minutes will be available once per quarter. Employees guarantee to finish the day's production before leaving the site.

UNION RECOGNITION AND MEMBERSHIP 9.

- The company recognises the Australasian Meat Industry Employees Union as (a) the union to represent its process workers.
- All employees shall be provided with be an application form to join the union at the point of recruitment and shall be introduced to the union delegate. (b)
- The company undertakes upon authorisation by any employee to deduct membership dues, as levied by the union in accordance with its rules, from the pay of employees who are members of The Australasian Meat Industry (c) Employees Union. Such monies collected shall be forwarded to the union in the month following collection, together with all necessary information to enable the reconciliation and crediting of subscriptions to members accounts.

WORKPLACE DELEGATES 10.

An employee elected as a union representative shall, upon notification to the company by the union, be recognised as the accredited union representative and shall be allowed the necessary time during working hours to interview relevant company representatives on matters affecting employees of the company.

CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE 11.

A critical part of this agreement is a commitment by employee's and the company to the ongoing overall review of the efficiency and competitiveness of the factory. This review will continue to be conducted jointly by management and employees under the guidance of the consultative committee.

This committee shall continue to meet throughout the term of this agreement to discuss and implement opportunities for further improvements in operations.

The consultative committee shall operate in accordance with the agreed Constitution.

12. CONSULTATION

The Company will continue to take every available opportunity to develop practices which lead to the strengthening of the direct Management and Employee relationship which enables the employees' to identify with the performance of the company.

The Consultative process is one such element in which all employees are able to make a contribution to the decision making process of the Company.

In recognition of the need for a joint approach to problem solving in the industry, the Registered parties commit themselves to ongoing consultation at all levels. Enterprise Agreement

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DISPUTES PROCEDURE 13...

The object of the Disputes Procedure is to:

- Promote resolution of disputes by measures based on consultation, (i) co-operation and discussion;
- reduce the level of industrial confrontation; and (ii)
- avoid interruption to the performance of work and the consequential (iii) loss of production and wages.

Should a dispute arise, in the future, at the works of the company, the following procedure shall apply:

- There shall not be a cessation of work. (a)
- The union delegate shall forthwith submit the dispute to the management. (b)
- In the first instance the dispute should be dealt with quickly and effectively between the job delegates and management. (c)
- Failing settlement of the dispute the management shall discuss the dispute with the President or Secretary of the union or other official(s) designated by (d) the union.
- During the discussions the status quo shall remain and work shall proceed normally. "Status quo" shall mean the situation existing immediately prior to (e) the dispute or the matter given rise to the dispute.
 - Failing agreement, the dispute may be referred to the Industrial Relations Commission of New South Wales for determination. (f)

14. **GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE**

Procedure in relation to an individual employee.

- The employee is required to notify (in writing or otherwise) the employer as (i) to the substance of the grievance, request a meeting with the employer for bilateral discussions and state the remedy sought.
- A grievance must initially be dealt with as close to the source as possible, with (ii) graduated steps for further discussions and resolution at higher levels of authority.
- Reasonable time limits must be allowed for discussions at each level of (iii) authority.
- At the conclusion of this discussion, the employer must provide, in writing (if (iv) requested) a response to the employee's grievance, if the matter has not been resolved, including reasons for not implementing any proposed remedy.
- While a procedure is being followed, normal work must continue. Registered (v) Enterprise Agreement

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The employee may be represented by the Union. (vi)

WAGE INCREASES 15.

- In consideration of the implementation of the productivity measures referred to (a) herein, the weekly wages of employees covered by this agreement shall be increased by 5% as the first pay period to commence on or after 5 August 1997. The new wage rates resulting from this increase are set out in the attached Schedule B Rates Pay.
- A further 5% increase in wages shall apply from the first pay period to commence on or after 5 August 1998 and are set out in the attached Schedule B Rates Pay. (b)
- A freezer allowance shall be paid as set out in Item 1 of table 2-Other Rates 16.1 and Allowances, of Part B, Monetary Rates.
- A fork lift allowance shall be as set out in Item 2 of the said table 2-Other Rates and 16.2 Allowances, of Part B, Monetary Rates.

DURATION 17.

This agreement shall take effect from the date it is approve by the Industrial Relations Commission, and shall remain in force until 5 August 1999. Thereafter the terms of this agreement shall remain in force in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Relations Act 1996.
