HOTEL EMPLOYEES (STATE) CONCILIATION COMMITTEE

INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS COMMISSION OF NEW SOUTH WALES

Application by the Australian Hotels' Association (N.S.W.), industrial organisation of employers.

(No. IRC 868 of 1996)

ORDER

The Commission orders that —

1. There be established a new Hotel Employees (State) Conciliation Committee for the industries and callings of —

Hotel employees including billiard markers, lift attendants, grooms, stablemen and yardmen, and all persons employed in bars and/or booths in the handling of liquor and in such work as is incidental thereto on showgrounds, racecourses, sports grounds, picnic grounds, etc., or any other place not being an hotel where temporary liquor bars are established for the sale of liquor in the State, excluding the County of Yancowinna;

excepting —

Engine drivers and firemen, greasers, trimmers, cleaners and pumpers engaged in or about the driving of engines, electrical crane, winch, and motor drivers;
Carters and drivers of motor and other power-propelled vehicles; and
Employees of The Electricity Commission of New South Wales, trading as Pacific Power.

2. The said committee shall consist of one representative of employers and one representative of employees.

3. The representative of employers shall be appointed, upon nomination as prescribed, by the Australian Hotels' Association (N.S.W.).

4. The representative of employees shall be appointed, upon nomination as prescribed, by the Australian Liquor, Hospitality and Miscellaneous Workers Union, New South Wales Branch.

5. This order shall take effect on and from 17 April 1996.
